Communities engaging in conversations about mortality at Death Café Gatherings



A Death Café is a social gathering where people come together to discuss topics related to death, dying, and the end of life. It

provides a comfortable and open environment for individuals to share their thoughts, feelings, and experiences surrounding mortality.

At a Death Café, participants engage in respectful conversations about a range of death-related subjects, including personal beliefs, fears, cultural practices, grief, and end-of-life planning.

The goal is to create a supportive space for individuals to explore and normalise the topic of death, allowing for greater awareness and acceptance.

Death Cafés are typically held in various settings such as cafés, community centres, or private homes. They are usually facilitated by individuals who are interested in promoting open conversations about death. Attendance is voluntary, and participants are encouraged to engage with respect, empathy, and an open mind.

One of the primary advantages of a Death Café is the opportunity it provides for people to confront their own mortality. By addressing the taboo nature of death, individuals can begin to reflect on their own lives, values, and priorities. These conversations prompt participants to contemplate their aspirations, regrets, and the legacy they hope to leave behind. Acknowledging death as an integral part of the human experience can lead to a renewed sense of purpose and a more profound appreciation for the present moment.

The conversations at Death Cafés are not limited to personal reflections on death. Practical matters, such as end-of-life planning, advance care directives, and funeral arrangements, are also discussed.

These discussions can assist individuals in making informed decisions about their own end-of-life preferences, ensuring that their wishes are respected and understood by loved ones.

By embracing these conversations, Death Cafés empower individuals to reclaim control over their own lives and deaths, ultimately reducing stress and uncertainty for both themselves and their families. Thus leading to meaningful conversations and a deeper appreciation of life and a more compassionate approach to the end-of-life journey.

At our visits to the Death Café at Denmark CRC we have had discussions around the following with Death Doula Kit Brewely:

- Natural burial sites in the Denmark Shire Cemetery and the laws around burials on private property (check with Local Government)
- Voluntary Assisted Dying (VAD) regulations and personal experiences
- Embalming, shrouds and coffin regulations
- Coffin making workshops to be held in Denmark
- Cold plate for body preservation, recently purchased by Death Doula, Kit Brewely, Demnark
- Funeral arrangements/requirement other than through Funeral Directors
- Sitting with loved ones at end of life

When someone dies at home in Western Australia, certain steps must be followed to comply with legal requirements.

- Confirm the death: If someone passes away at home, call emergency services or the person's doctor to report the death and seek guidance.
- Obtain a Medical Certificate: Request a medical certificate from the deceased person's doctor to certify the cause of death. If unavailable, contact the police.
- Register the Death: Within seven days, register the death with the Registry of Births, Deaths, and Marriages in Western Australia. Obtain forms from their website or contact them directly.
- Arrange for the body: Decide whether to keep the body at home temporarily or transfer it to a mortuary or funeral home for preparation. You can legally keep a body at home for 5 days with arrangements made to ensure body preservation eg cold packs around organs, cold plate etc.
- Transportation: Contact a funeral home or transport company to arrange the transfer if needed. They will guide you through legal requirements and provide assistance.
- Notify authorities: Inform the deceased person's doctor and local police station if not already done,

especially in cases of unnatural deaths or when a medical certificate is unavailable.

- Plan the funeral: Choose the type of funeral or memorial service, select a venue, and make arrangements for religious or cultural practices.
- Burial or cremation: Coordinate with a cemetery or crematorium to make arrangements based on whether the deceased person will be buried or cremated.
- Obtain Death Certificate: Apply for a death certificate from the Registry of Births, Deaths, and Marriages after registering the death. The Death Certificate is a crucial legal document for various purposes, including estate settlement.

It is important to note that this step-by-step process provides a general guideline. The specific requirements and procedures may vary depending on the circumstances of the death. It is advisable to consult with the relevant authorities, such as the Registry of Births, Deaths, and Marriages, and seek guidance from professionals or legal experts to ensure compliance with all legal obligations and procedures.

A Death Doula is a trained professional who provides emotional, spiritual, and practical support to individuals and their families during the dying process and after death. They are professional, confidential and caring people. We are very lucky to have Death Doula Dianne Pickersgill in Walpole. If anyone would be interested in joining/creating a Death Café right here in Walpole please contact the Walpole CRC on 9840 1395 or email info@walpole.org.au to express your interest etc. If you are interested in the Death Doula services available in the Walpole/Denmark area, please let us know and we can help you get in touch.

In the meantime you can join us on the bus to the Death Café in Denmark on the third Monday of every month to catch up with Kit Brewely, Death Doula at the Denmark CRC. The next Death Café at Denmark CRC on 21st August will be centred around Advanced Care Planning facilitated by Irene Montefiore. Bookings are essential as places are limited. There is also a coffin making workshop for anyone dying to know.



Nature Notes: Slipper Orchid



The slipper orchid, also known as the western tongue orchid (*Cryptostylis ovata*) is the only member of the genus *Cryptostylis* found in Western Australia. It favours our wet southwest

forest areas. It is quite unique as it has leaves all year around. The leaves are egg-shaped and have a white vein running down the middle. They are also quite large, about 250mm long (from 4-10 inches) and are a dark green colour.

These orchids grow in colonies, although only one or two plants may flower at a time. Each plant has up to fifteen flowers with one flower showing at any one time. As this one is fertilised and dies it becomes a seed pod and a new flower emerges. This gives the plant a long flowering season and prevents selffertilisation.

Like all Western Australian orchids, slipper orchids are masters of deceit. The flower gives off the pheromones of the female wasp of the *Lissopimpla excelsa*. The male wasp lands and tries to mate with the flower, in the process he accidently collects the *pollinia* (bundle of pollen). He then transfers this to a different plant when he lands on its flower and tries to mate with it!

In orchids, the stigma and stamens (pollen receiving parts) are combined together in a structure known as the *column*. Because the pollen is in a bundle, an exceptional number of ovules are pollinated at the same time. The slipper shape of the flower is especially designed so the insect will land on it. This is a example of how west Australian orchids may have bizarre-shaped flowers in order to allow specific pollinators to be attracted to them.


Most flowers provide their insect visitors with nectar and pollen but not all orchids do this. Some provide false pollen while others mimic other flowers, but our orchid is specially designed to attract the male *Lissopimpla excelsa* wasp. As we have had a good rainy season I expect our spring to be spectacular, so look out for orchids they are fascinating and some of the best flowers for tricking insects.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINARY ELECTION CLOSE OF ENROLMENTS Shire of Denmark ROLL CLOSE: 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023

You may be eligible to be enrolled to vote in the local government elections on 21 October 2023 if you live in or are an owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Denmark.

Residents

You are automatically enrolled to vote if you are on the State Electoral Roll as at 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. If you are not already on the State Electoral Roll and meet the eligibility criteria, or if you have changed address recently, you must complete an enrolment form.

Enrolment Forms

You can enrol or update your details online, or download an enrolment form, via the Western Australian Electoral Commission website (<u>www.elections.wa.gov.au/enrol</u>). Forms are also available from the Australian Electoral Commission (<u>www.aec.gov.au</u>). Enrolments and updates must be completed and received by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023.

Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers

If you are a non-resident owner or occupier of rateable property in the Shire of Denmark and are on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, you are eligible to enrol to vote. If you are **not** on the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll and own or occupy rateable property in the Shire of Denmark you may be eligible to enrol to vote. This applies if you were on the last electoral roll for the Shire of Denmark prior to May 1996 and have owned or occupied rateable property in the district continuously since this time. Please contact your local government for details. Owners of land who were on the last Local Government roll continue to retain that status until they cease to own the rateable property to which the enrolment relates. Occupiers do not have continuous enrolment and should contact the Shire of Denmark to confirm their enrolment status. To be eligible to enrol as an occupier, you will need to have a right of continuous occupation under a lease, tenancy agreement or other legal instrument for at least the next three months following the date of the application to enrol.

Joint Owners and Occupiers

If a rateable property is owned or occupied by more than two people, a majority of the owners/occupiers may nominate two persons from amongst themselves who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll, to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Corporations

A body corporate that owns or occupies rateable property may nominate two people who are on either the State or Commonwealth Electoral Roll to enrol as owner/occupier electors.

Enrolment Forms – Non-Resident Owners and Occupiers Only

Enrolment forms can be obtained from local governments and must be lodged with the Chief Executive Officer by 5:00 PM Friday, 25 August 2023. Further information can be obtained from the Shire of Denmark.
