Notice regarding Westnet Westnet

Those of you with a Westnet email address may have seen a message in your inbox regarding Westnet's upcoming move to The Messaging Company following their parent company TPG Telecom's announcement they'll be closing their email service.

What this means for you:

If you use a TPG, iinet, internode or Westnet email address, you'll need to back up your emails and import them to another host like Outlook or Gmail - this means you'll have to make a new email address. Your second option is to follow TPG, iinet, internode or Westnet's steps to transfer your email over to their new host The Messaging Company. The messaging company is a paid service - TPG has pledged to pay for twelve months of service when customers transfer to The Messaging Company, but you'll need to pay by September 2024.

If you wish to transfer to The Messaging Company, the steps are below:

- 1. Go to The Messaging Company website at: https://register.themessagingco.com.au/westnet and click TRANSFER.
- 2. Enter your Westnet email address.
- 3. The Messaging Company will send a unique PIN to the email address provided. This PIN will expire after 60 minutes. Promptly enter this PIN on The Messaging Company website to authorise your signup. **Important:** Do not share this PIN with anyone.
- 4. You will need to enter your name and contact number, then accept the Transfer from Westnet and the Terms of Service & Privacy Policy.
- 5. Your email address is now on standby to move to The Messaging Company. You can keep using your Westnet email address as usual in the meantime. *continued page 2...*



- 6. You will receive a reminder via email before your Westnet email address will be transferred to The Messaging Company. After transferring, you may be required to create a new password for your email address.
- 7. If you have any issues with your Westnet email address after moving to The Messaging Company, you will need to contact The Messaging Company for support as Westnet will no longer be able to assist.

What happens if I don't choose to keep my email address?

- You don't need to do anything if you're happy for your Westnet email address to be deleted.
- If you do not move to The Messaging
 Company before the date advised in the notice
 emailed to you, your Westnet email address
 will be suspended and you will no longer be
 able to send or receive emails.

Once suspended, if you do not choose to move your Westnet email address to The Messaging Company, the following will apply:

- The email address will be deleted from 30th November 2023 and can no longer be recovered.
- Any email forwarding to or from your Westnet email address will stop.
- You won't be able to access any existing emails stored on the Westnet mail server.
- Any messages sent to your Westnet email address will bounce back to the sender as undeliverable.

If you use your Westnet email address as the contact email address for your Westnet account, please update your contact details to a different email address in MyAccount.

Can I recover my email address after it is suspended?

Suspended email addresses must be unsuspended before you can opt-in to be moved to the Messaging Company email platform. Unsuspension can be completed by contacting us on 1300 937 863. Once unsuspended, please follow these steps. This recovery process will be available until 30th November 2023. After 30th November 2023, suspended email addresses will be deleted and can no longer be recovered.

As always, please make an appointment to see me at the WCRC if you have any questions or concerns, please make sure you do so before the changeover date to give me plenty of time to assist with the swap.





Menstruation Workshop



I am so grateful to the eight women who came to the Menstrual Intimacy
Workshop Friday 18th. It was so beautiful to sit in a circle with women of all ages, with such a diversity of experience in all things, including being a woman.

For me it was such a pleasure and a privilege to shine a light on a perspective of the menstrual cycle that is ancient

and yet relatively unknown by the majority of women today. Unknown and yet deeply felt, as there was not one woman in the room who did not resonate with the information that they received.



BAITING TO PROTECT NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's Western Shield program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp tortoise





Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.



Nature Notes: Blackbutt (Eucalyptus patens)



Blackbutt or yarri as the Noongar people call it, is one of the six Western Australian forest giants. It is not related to the trees of the same name in the eastern states. It grows mostly in the valleys in more favourable valley soils. It is an extremely hard wood and difficult to work but has decorative features and so is sometimes used in furniture making.

Unfortunately, as this is a tree that grows with jarrah forest on better soils and where farming is viable, many were cleared since European settlement.

Jarrah, wandoo and marri still exist on higher ridges but many places have been cleared for farming.



Blackbutt is a member of the *Myrtaceae family* and is found around Walpole. It has rough bark on the trunk and branches and has lance-

shaped leaves, distinct oval fruit and creamy white flowers. It may grow to a height of 45m with a diameter of 1.8m in favourable conditions but will be smaller in poorer soils. The bark is thick and corky and has longitudinal furrows. It is grey on the outside with a yellow tinge on the inside surface.

Flowering is in July and August or in November and February. The flowers attract many birds and insects. Rosellas, ringneck parrots and honeyeaters are often observed feeding on the nectar during the flowering seasons. The rough bark provides homes for insects which are sought out by birds and other hunters that hop along the branches. The grey honeyeater also favours this tree for finding insects. Blackbutt likes gravelly soils with sandy clay or loam. It is called blackbutt because the trunk is often blackened by fire. It is extremely dangerous in fires as it sheds many embers. As a eucalypt it benefits from fire in

gaining space for new plants. It may grow in groups and the young saplings are well adapted, with broader leaves which face upwards in order to obtain light. As the tree grows it forms the downward hanging leaves typical of the eucalypt family. This plant is mostly found in the Peel, Southwest and Great Southern regions. It can be found as far north as the Avon River.

DRAFT REVISED LOCAL PLANNING POLICY NO. 18: TOURISM AND COMMERCIAL LAND USES IN THE RESIDENTIAL, SPECIAL RESIDENTIAL AND SPECIAL RURAL ZONES

Invitation for Public Comment

Local Planning Policy No. 18 provides guidance for the establishment of tourism land uses in the Residential Zone.

On 15 August 2023 the Council adopted a draft revised Policy for public consultation

The draft revised Policy proposes to increase the range of commercial land uses and zones that the Policy relates to, but does not change the land uses that may be permitted (which is specified in Town Planning Scheme No. 3).

The draft revised Policy aims to

- Enable the establishment of small-scale commercial and tourism businesses as a means of income, employment and economic development.
- Limit the scale of businesses to avoid detrimental impacts on the character and amenity of established residential neighbourhoods.





DRAFT REVISED LOCAL PLANNING POLICY NO. 44: EXEMPTIONS FROM DEVELOPMENT APPROVAL

Local Planning Policy No. 44 identifies types of development that do not need planning approval (before a building permit).

On 15 August 2023 the Council adopted a draft revised Policy for public consultation. The draft revised Policy proposes to increase the range of development that does not need approval, particularly for minor and incidental works.

Types of development that are identified in the Policy and meet the standards specified will not need planning approval, removing one step in the approvals process and reducing 'red tape' for common types of development.

For some types of development a building permit may still be required – the Shire's Planning and Building staff are available to discuss how changes to this Policy relate to your project and advise on the approvals you will need before getting started.

Nominations Requirements

Candidates are required to lodge with the Returning Officer:

- a completed nomination in the prescribed form, signed and witnessed. This form is available from the Returning Officer or the Western Australian Electoral Commission (www.elections.wa.gov.au);
- a single A4 page profile of not more than 1,000 characters (including spaces) containing information about the candidate;
- a nomination deposit of \$100 (cash, EFT, bank cheque or postal order);
- a recent passport-sized photograph (optional);
- every candidate must have completed the online course titled Local Government Candidate Induction, available at www.dlgsc.wa.gov.au, prior to nominating; and
- (optional) in addition to your A4 profile, you may provide additional information that you consider to be
 relevant to your candidature. This written statement must be not more than 2,000 characters (including
 spaces), must be in the English language and is for publication on the local government's official
 website.

The Commission has developed an online system called Nomination Builder to assist candidates to complete their nomination form which includes the candidate profile. This is the preferred method of completing the nomination form and profile for elections conducted by the Commission. Candidates complete their nomination details and profile, print the completed form which has a reference number allocated and lodge it with the Returning Officer. The nomination builder can be accessed via www.elections.wa.gov.au.

You cannot use Nomination Builder to prepare the additional information.

Where an agent lodges a nomination on a candidate's behalf, it must be in the prescribed form with a written authorisation signed by the candidate.

The documents may be hand delivered or posted to the Returning Officer and must be received by the close of nominations.
