



After verifying that no one was hurt and they had some water, Michael took their details and headed back to Walpole as quickly as he could.


Arriving at the Walpole Police Station, Michael was greeted by local policeman Steve Paige, who promptly informed Michael that he already knew exactly why he'd come!





Nature Notes: Great Egret (Ardea alba)



As I was going up to Perth last week we stopped at Australind for lunch and a Great White Egret flew over us. This must be one of the most elegant of the southwest water birds. It is a member of the heron family and it has a long sinuous neck which is longer than the body. When they fly they tuck this under.

There are different sub species in Africa and Asia the Americas and southern Europe. In Australia the Great Egret and the Little Egret are found in the south and the medium-sized egret is found in the north, along with the other two species.

This heron has an all-white plumage. When not breeding its beak is yellow, however this turns black when breeding in spring. The eye turns red and a patch of skin on the face turns green. It also develops long breeding plumes on its tail. The bird is about 80-90cm long and has a wing span of 131-170cm. The call is a low croak.

They inhabit freshwater lakes, swamps, rivers, dams and estuaries. The birds will nest in trees near the water and both parents raise the chicks. They incubate 3-6 eggs, but usually only two hatch. It takes about six weeks before the hatchlings fledge.

When not breeding, egrets are usually seen alone. They eat frogs, fish, crustaceans and insects, with fish being the preferred food. They will stand very still in the water for a long time before spearing the fish with their beak. Conservation status is considered to be of least concern by the International Union for Conservation of Nature, however, like all water birds loss of habitat - both wetlands and trees - is considered to be a risk factor going forward.


