May his legacy continue.



Letter from John's daughter, Lotte



Thank you, Papa, for your eternal optimism and encouragement. Thank you for capturing Mama's heart and gifting her two happy, healthy daughters to join our sister Helen. Thank you for giving Jenny and I the freedom to be wilderness children; first exploring our early childhood home in Redcliffe and along the Swan River; then the home of our hearts, the Walpole Wilderness and finally encouraging us to explore the world. "Safety First" you told us and we listened. "Strength. Perseverance. Patience. Wisdom" and we're still striving to achieve those goals.

One of my happiest memories is a marroning trip up the Deep River. We paddled our ancient orange and blue inflatable boat¹ a kilometre up the river to our favourite isolated spot. Mama and you taught us to set our nets with chook pellets in an old stocking and a drop of whale oil² to attract the monsters that we knew were hiding under the fallen logs.

After the string of nets was set, we cooled off in the hot summer sun, jumping naked off the granite boulders into the deep cool water, splashing so much, swallowing so much beautiful river water, that we were sure all the marron would have fled.

Then, "the youngest always goes first", so Jenny balanced her way out on a giant log, 3 metres above the water. Quietly, so the log wouldn't vibrate and give us away. Snatch! Up came the net! Jenny could barely lift it! The biggest marron you've ever seen and so heavy that it almost pulled Jenny back off the log! The tail flicked and the marron leapt, but Jenny had that line taut and when the net was sitting on top of the log she pounced and grabbed that monster from behind! No berries³, so into the hessian bag!

Never again did we catch a marron bigger than that first one caught by Jenny.

With our haul safely secured in the bottom of the boat, we paddled back down stream, scraping over every hidden boulder and running aground on every snag. Surely, winter would be a better time to attempt to paddle that river! Pffffftttttttt!!!!!!

Bubbles everywhere! Water in the bottom of the boat! Listing to the side! Grab the bag with the marron! And all four of us into the drink, as one tube of the boat deflated in mere seconds! Scrabbling to the nearest sloping rock, only to find slippery algae providing nothing to hold on to. Finally, wedging the boat and drenched passengers between a rock and a hard place. Of course, this was just a challenge! A bit of rope tied everything back onto the remaining floating sausage and we all swam our way around endless bends until we finally made it back to the rapids from which we had launched!

Jenny and I have never had such a fun time! I'm sure Mama rejoiced at our happiness, despite her wet clothes and boots.

We love you Papa and we know you will be with us for every adventure that lies in store for both of us and for your grandchildren Bryn, Zamia and Appin. And we know your own adventure will continue into the infinite.

From Gravicles you came. To Gravicles you return. Long live your Gravicles. Amen.

Nature Notes: Little Shearwater



The little shearwater is a type of sea bird, its binomial name is *Puffinus assimilis*. Despite its scientific name, it is unrelated to puffins but is more closely related to the petrel family. It

got this name because both these birds nest in burrows. Shearwaters are so-named because of their shearing flight; they fly with wings outstretched close to the water. Colouration changes as dark upperparts and white underparts alternate in flight.

The little shearwater is a gregarious species of bird and many can be seen in Autumn when they migrate. These birds are silent at sea but nest in large colonies which are full of its cackling calls at night. Its main food is fish and molluscs; they will dive to collect food. They have tubes on their beaks and a hook at the end, these tubes are said to assist with finding prey and migration but may also play a part in getting rid of salt. This bird is 25-30 cms long with a wing span of 58-67 cms. In flight, shearwaters resemble the shape of a cross. This bird produces only one egg per year, about 51x35mms in size and both parents attend the nest. The egg is incubated between 52 and 58 days.

Colonies typically nest on islands off the southwest coast of Western Australia. They nest in cracks in the rocks or in cavities located in grassy fields. Nests are concealed in burrows to prevent predators eating the egg. They also prefer moonless nights for nest making. In Australia and New Zealand these birds have been hunted by people in a practice known as Mutton Birding. However their conservation status is still considered to be of least concern by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature.

Most shearwaters, including little shearwaters, migrate for long distances from the North Pacific Ocean of Alaska to islands off Australia. That's a distance of 16,000kms in less than three weeks. Incredible! Some types will not fly over land and even go around by longer routes to avoid this. Little shearwaters are also long-lived, with one bird reported to be 55 years old.



Shut the door on real estate and rental scammers



Buying or renting a residential property involves significant financial transactions which, increasingly, are targets for scammers.

Over the last year, WA ScamNet received 129 complaints of real estate and rental scams that left 74 West Australians almost one million dollars, in total, out of pocket.

Rental and real estate scammers try to trick you out of your money when you need to transfer payments or make deposits to banks, real estate and settlement agents or landlords.

Real estate scammers often impersonate businesses, such as a settlement agent or bank, by using an email address similar to the real one. They can redirect your payments into their fraudulent accounts by persuading you to download software that gives them access to your computer, or by obtaining a one-time bank verification code from you, enabling your payment to be 're-directed' - to the scammer.

Rental scammers often advertise scam properties on Gumtree or Facebook that feature appealing property photographs. They give you an address to drive by the property, but make excuses about why you can't go inside for an inspection. They then ask you for a bond or rent payment upfront, when that advertised property might already be rented, up for sale, or not even exist.

Retrieving your money paid to fraudulent accounts is difficult, so stay alert to prevent being scammed. If you're buying property, never provide a verification code for your bank account to someone over the phone, always call your settlement agent or bank to confirm details before transferring or paying money, and never give anyone remote access to your computer.

You can outsmart rental scammers by dealing only with landlords or licenced real estate property managers who you can meet in-person, inspecting properties before signing any agreements or paying any money, and requiring a copy of the signed lease agreement, and the property's keys, in exchange for any money you agree to pay.

If you suspect a real estate or rental scam, let WA ScamNet know by calling 1300 30 40 54 or via the website at www.scamnet.wa.gov.au, where you can also sign up for alerts to keep informed about current scams.

If you've suffered financial loss from a scam, be vigilant for 'follow up' scams where scammers pretend to be online investigators wanting to retrieve your stolen money for a fee.






