Environmental Education

On Friday 24th November Walpole received the Environment Education State Award at the annual Keep Australia Beautiful event held at Kings Park.

Liz Edmonds, local artist and joint owner of Petrichor Galley accepted the Award in recognition of her 'Tale of Two Trees' event which attracted over 200 visitors, including several prominent environmental scientists, which helped lift Walpole's standing in the academic world.

Walpole's community projects are at the forefront of technology, innovation and creativity. The focus on

Elizabeth blended her scientific background in paleoecology with her artistic skills to tell the story of these trees and the threats they face. The exhibition was held by way of a community workshop, bringing together experts working in and around the two trees.

Nature Notes: Shining Bronze Cuckoo



The Shining Bronze Cuckoo, *Chrysococcyx lucidus* is one of the smallest cuckoos. It is found in Australia, Indonesia, New Caledonia New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands and Vanuatu.

It is also found around Walpole, though they are fairly difficult to see unless one flies into the window, which is what happened at our place, unfortunately. The shining bronze cuckoos that are found in the southern part of WA migrate to Papua New Guinea and the Lesser Sunda Islands, which is quite a long flight!

They are parasitic and will parasitise the nests of various *Gerygone* species having the same range as these birds. They prefer domed nests but will lay an egg in an open nest. The cuckoos generally lay one egg and it is usually dark in colour, this may prevent it being rejected by the host bird as in a domed nest it may be harder to see. They are quite an attractive bird and the feathers really do shine. The wings are a shining green colour and are bronze on the back; the breast feathers are striped black and white and the face white with dark mottling. They are about 18cm long and have a wing span of 25-32cm. The bill is black and the feet are black with yellow undersides.

The female cuckoo will lay a single egg in the host's nest and will eject one of the host's eggs. The chick will eject any competing hatchlings from the nest.

The hosts will continue to feed the chick even after it grows bigger than the host bird. In Western Australia the cuckoo eggs are a matte olive brown. This brown colour may prevent secondary parasitism by another cuckoo. These birds have a beautiful if piercing call, high pitched with a descending finish. As these birds

don't generally build nests and aren't that easy to spot, not much is known about their mating behavior.

They eat insects, including beetles and ladybirds, and caterpillars and have a special gizzard which can cope with caterpillar spines, these the bird simply spits out.

Their conservation status is secure although they have been noted as lowering in numbers in the wheatbelt of WA. They are predated on by cats and, as I have mentioned, fly into windows.

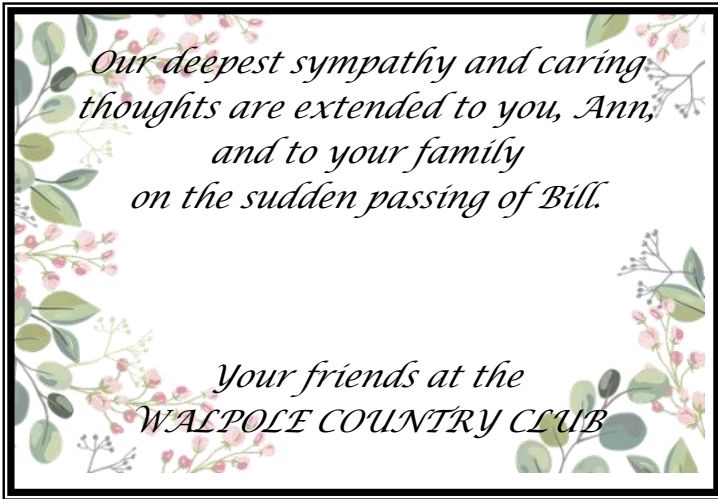

Don't get stung by scams or parcel delays this shopping season



Online shoppers are urged to be on high alert for scams and to remember their consumer rights in the lead up to major retail events like the Black Friday, Cyber Monday and Boxing Day sales.

So far this year, scammers have stolen \$396,293 from 153 WA victims in online purchase scams, according to new figures from WA ScamNet. In 2022, more than \$9 million was lost to online shopping scams across Australia, according to the National Anti-Scam Centre.

Commissioner for Consumer Protection, Trish Blake, encouraged online shoppers to do their research and read reviews of stores to be sure websites are reputable and safe to use.

“Major sales events are a chance for scammers to prey on excited shoppers looking for a deal, so it's important to be careful,” Ms Blake said. “Keep safe by avoiding suspicious websites, being wary of very cheap high-end products and offers on buy, swap, sell marketplaces.

“The best insurance against being scammed is to only pay by credit card or a secure payment method such as PayPal as there may be an opportunity to get your money back if something goes wrong or the item is not supplied.”

Consumers are also reminded to read the terms and conditions before clicking ‘pay’ to understand the

returns policy and how complaints are handled. Some businesses will not provide a refund or credit for change-of-mind purchases.

“If you buy a product or a service in Australia and it is poor quality, not what was advertised or isn't delivered in a reasonable time, you may be eligible for a repair, replacement, or refund. These rights still apply if an item is on sale,” the Commissioner said.

As the countdown to Christmas begins, it is important to check delivery timeframes for online items, which could take longer than expected to arrive.

“Allow extra time, check Christmas cut-off dates and find out if it is being shipped from overseas, as it may be difficult to get a refund or replacement from an international business.

“To be totally safe from both parcel delays and fake websites, the best option for Christmas shoppers is to buy from a bricks and mortar store where they can take immediate possession of the gift.”

To make in-store Christmas shopping more convenient, 33 extra trading hours for general retail shops in the Perth metropolitan area have been approved and will begin on Saturday 9th December 2023 until Sunday 31st December 2023.

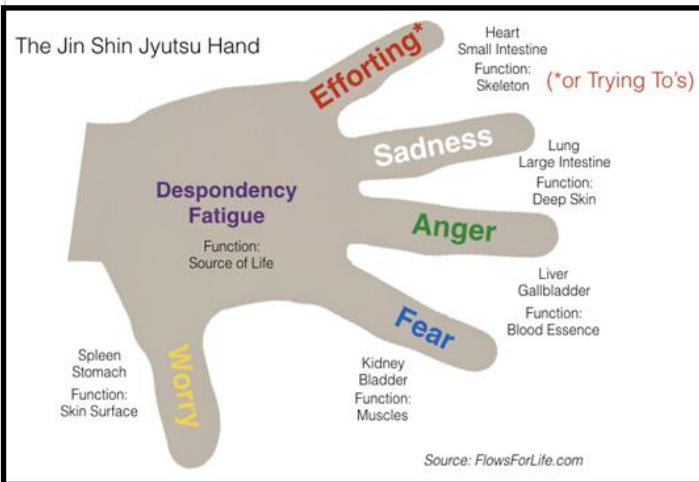
During this period, Sunday and public holiday trading has been extended an extra four hours a day, 8am to 6pm (normally 11am to 5pm), with an additional one hour on Saturdays, 8am to 6pm (normally 8am to 5pm).

From Monday 18th December 2023 until Friday 22nd December 2023 inclusive, larger shops can choose to open one hour earlier from 7am until 9pm on weekdays (normally 8am to 9pm).

Exploring the Art of Jin Shin Jyutsu



The Walpole CRC played host to a gathering of individuals eager to delve into the ancient art of Jin Shin Jyutsu. We were treated to a workshop that focused predominantly on the intricate and intense practice of harmonising energy within the body through the hands.

Jin Shin Jyutsu is an ancient Japanese healing art that aims to balance the body's energy by using gentle touch on specific points. The workshop, facilitated by experienced Jin Shin Jyutsu practitioner, Susanjane Morison from Denmark, drew a diverse crowd of participants, all seeking to enhance their well-being and discover the profound impact of this art.

We were guided through the basic principles of Jin Shin Jyutsu. The hands, regarded as powerful conduits of energy in this practice, took center stage as we learned various techniques to bring balance and harmony to our bodies.

The workshop gave us a brief overview of the Jin Shin Jyutsu philosophy, emphasising the belief that energy flows through the body along specific pathways. By simply holding or gently massaging key points on the hands, you can release blockages and allow energy to flow freely, promoting physical, mental, and emotional well-being.

Each finger is associated with different organs and emotional states within your body. By holding the thumb it is believed to harmonise energy related to worry and stress, while holding the index finger may address issues related to fear. We were guided through these finger holds and other hand placements exploring and experiencing the unique effects on their energy flow.

Many reported feelings of relaxation, reduced stress,

and increased vitality as we explored the gentle art of harmonising energy within ourselves. The simplicity of the techniques were surprising.

The success of the Jin Shin Jyutsu workshop is a testament to the growing interest in holistic well-being within our community. 

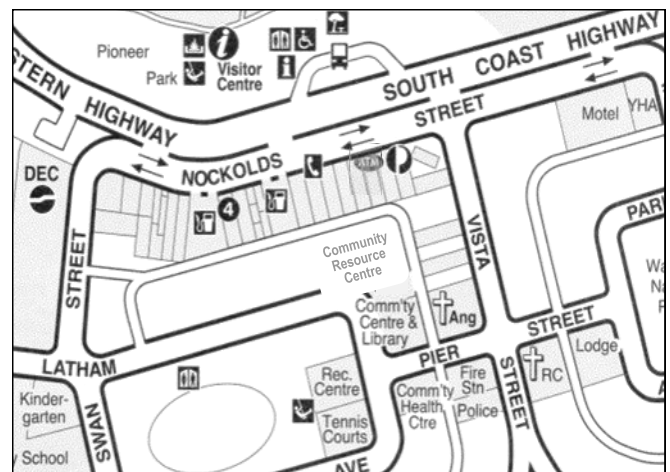
