

BAITING TO PROTECT NATIVE WILDLIFE

Under the Parks and Wildlife Service's Western Shield program, baiting to control foxes and feral cats occurs on more than three million hectares of conservation lands in Western Australia.

The baits used are toxic to introduced animals but not to native animals which have an evolved tolerance to the active compound (1080). All baited areas are signposted.

Baiting occurs on a regular and ongoing basis to protect endangered native animals including the numbat, western ground parrot and western swamp





Attention pet owners: these baits will kill domestic dogs and cats. Baited areas must be considered dangerous for pet dogs and cats at all times.

Temporary change in water supply for Walpole

To meet peak demand this summer, Water Corporation expects to supplement the local source at Butlers Dam with carted water from Denmark and Albany.

Residents and visitors may notice water carting trucks on the road during this time, and we ask all road users to take extra care.

As your water will be blended from different sources you may notice slight changes in its aesthetics and taste. We assure you that your water will always continue to meet 100% of the health standards mandated by the Australian Drinking Water Quality Guidelines, set out by the Department of Health.

At this stage, we anticipate we may need to cart for periods between mid-December 2023 and late April 2024, dependant on demand, rainfall and the progression of new source project works.

On his voyage, Bill also stopped for a tour of our local Tree Top Walk. He was immediately struck by the beauty of the forest giants stating, "I wanted to get a sense of the biodiversity of the place, the scale of the landscape. To find out about these massive trees, where they came

from, how did they get to be here? And is this walkway safe enough for three people?" The walkway certainly *is* safe enough, Bill!

Helen Nash, a long-time tour guide at the Tree Top Walk appeared on screen with Bill. When asked about her experience, Helen responded, "Bill Bailey is such a relaxed and lovely person, so it was easy to talk to him! I think he would put anyone at ease."

While Helen and Bill discussed sword grass and quokkas, there was a bit of a kafuffle behind the scenes. "There were people who recognised him while we were filming or asked what we were doing. There was a group of French tourists and we had to practice our school French!" Helen told the *Weekly*.

This episode has been made available across the world; appearing on ABC, Apple TV and Channel 4 in the UK. Helen spoke to us about the reception she's had since the broadcast, "The programme certainly puts WA on the map! I have had lots of friends and relatives from oversees talking about it. The response to the programme and to the Tree Top Walk has been very positive. I was in Esperance recently and I had strangers commenting on the programme. It can only be positive for Walpole, Albany and Esperance areas!"

Helen spoke to us about some of the moments off camera, where a more personable Bill spoke to her, "My favourite moments were off camera when we had time to talk about family, how I ended up in Australia and Bill's previous visits to Australia. He really is a nature lover and was genuinely interested in the plants and animals in the forest." After a bit of banter, Bill then leaves the Tree Top Walk for a swim with Basketball legend Luc Longely, a visit to Whale World, a performance with the Albany Shanty Men and a stop-off at Stonehenge, Esperance.

It was lovely to see local locations shared for the whole world to see.

Helen said that she was honoured to represent the Tree Top Walk on the programme and enjoyed showcasing the unique flora and fauna that this area has to offer. We'd like to thank Helen Nash for giving her time to the *Weekly* for this article.

Nature Notes: Common greenshank



The common greenshank is a wading bird, its scientific name is *Tringa nebularia*. The birds live in marshy or brackish habitats mostly inland lakes and eat small invertebrates, amphibians and fish.

This is a sub-artic bird, breeding from northern Scotland and Europe, it migrates south in winter to Africa, the Indian subcontinent and Australasia.

It is related to the greater yellowlegs and the spotted redshank. The common greenshank is the largest of them all.

This bird is a green sandpiper. Its method of hunting is to wade in the water and probe the mud or sand. The long beak is sensitive to touch.

Common greenshanks have brown upperparts in breeding colours and grey-brown when they are not breeding, which is when we see them during the northern hemisphere's winter. Their lower bill has an upturned appearance and plumage is white below. It takes three years for them to fully mature. In the second year they will have half their breeding colours and during the third year they obtain full breeding plumage. Their legs are long and greenish, lifted behind them during flight and they show a white wedge on their back in the air.

They are 32-35cms long.

Like all sandpipers they nest in a scrape in the ground in which they lay up to four eggs. They are social and are generally seen with others of their kind.

Common greenshanks are not threatened and are classed as of least concern by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature.

I love being a greenshank! Each year we spend time in Scotland then fly to Australia for the holidays.






