

FREE PLAY IN THE PARK SESSIONS STARTING IN WALPOLE



Local Walpole residents, in particular exhausted mums and dads, or grandparents and carers who aren't quite sure what to do with an under five-year-old, are encouraged to take advantage of the Y WA's free Play in the Park programme starting

Wednesday 13th March. Operating at The Walpole Sport and Recreation Centre Park on the second Wednesday of every month from 10am to 12pm, the free service offers supported play time for zero to four-year-olds and is open to anyone keen to make new friends, gain peer support, step out from their usual parenting duties and benefit from social interaction for their little ones.

Run by two qualified Educators from the Y WA (formerly YMCA), mums, dads, grandparents, carers, nannies or anyone caring for young children can drop in at any time during the two-hour session or stay for the duration, with no commitment required.

The Y WA Programme Co-Ordinator, Geraldine Pegler, said, "We know every child has different nap times and this changes constantly too, which is why we encourage people to come at any point in our two -hour session and stay for as little or as long as it suits. Also, not having to enrol and pay a fee means you can come when it suits, whatever works best for you, we are here each month."

The programme is run using theories that are researched and evidence based to support child development. Play in the Park heads to the park in Walpole with a bus load of toys and activities each month and there is always a different theme, for example, the beach theme has a sensory pool with water and shells for the kids to play around in. Balancing equipment assists with gross motor skills such as walking the plank and encouraging kids to jump off the end and into hoops and there is always plenty of playdough to assist with fine motor skills.

Geraldine adds, "Our activities are aimed at helping kids through play-based learning and challenging them at their own level, but it's also about educating parents and carers on how to play with their kids at home and give them easy ideas they can take away. Plus, it's a great space to be able to see and speak with people who may have children a little bit older than yours and see and hear how they are going."

The established Play in the Park programme has been running for around 15 years and always includes free fruit for morning tea and a story read to the children. All you need to bring is a water bottle and suitable clothing according to the weather.

Nature Notes: Kookaburra



The laughing kookaburra was actually introduced into southwest Australia - this is probably not so good as they nest in tree hollows and compete with other species, nevertheless they are here and so worth looking at. Their scientific name is *Dacelo novaeguineae*. They are members of the kingfisher family but unlike most kingfishers they are not particularly associated with water. Recognised by their plumage and voice, which is like human laughter, this has meant their inclusion in many cultural contexts particularly early Australian films.

Their native habitat is the Eastern States of Australia and New Guinea. They were also introduced to Tasmania. Kingfishers are birds of prey so they eat insects worms and crustaceans, although small snakes, mammals, frogs and birds may be eaten.

Prey is caught by pouncing from a suitable perch. Small prey is eaten whole but larger prey is usually killed first. It may be the fact that they kill small snakes that lead to them being introduced to the southwest of WA and Tasmania. In the north of WA they are replaced by the blue winged variety which is not introduced. Kookaburras inhabit areas where there are suitable trees. High perches are favoured.


Kookaburras mate for life and are cooperative breeders. Both parents share incubation duties and caring for the young. Offspring of previous breeding seasons also help to bring up the young birds. The nest is in a tree hollow or excavated termite mound. The clutch size is 2 or 3 eggs, which are incubated after 25 days. The breeding season is from August to January.

Even though kookaburras steal food from barbecues it is not helpful to feed them as most ground meat does not contain enough roughage for their diet.

When I was in Kings Park one day a young kookaburra landed on my shoulder. It was soft but gave me a fright and I ricked my neck. Kookaburras can be a nuisance in picnic areas, but like all native birds they are protected. We are inclined to attribute human characteristics to creatures but their laughing call is actually a warning to other birds not to enter their territory. They are not considered to be at risk of extinction by the International Union for the Conservation of Nature.

Dear Editor.



Walpole is among many isolated communities in this land of 7.5 million square kms, where services become more limited and adaptations need to be made.

I am now a consumer of a Home Care Package, an initiative run by the Federal Government to assist the aged to remain in their own homes. It is known in Walpole as the Staying in Place programme.

The scheme uses local workers at respectable rates of pay. The workers or contractors are assessed by a company called Mable to evaluate what work they are able to perform. Specific qualifications are required for things like personal care and the administration of medication.

As a stroke sufferer and now a consumer of these services, I receive assistance required to live in my own home and maintain a sense of independence. I can still make my own decisions and choices of care. I have less need of medical care and my level of rehabilitation is supported and assisted.

I am encouraged to have greater control over my own life. I can make my own choices and establish my own goals which has included independence, wellness and re-ablement.

The saying: 'it takes a village to raise a child', echoes similarities for elders. We require the engaging support, respect, social cohesion and caring abilities which are now delivered to us in this region. As a result, I feel more connected with improved well-being and have commenced a chance to a healthier and better outlook.

Health professionals understand the parameters of maintaining well-being in our communities. It can improve our sleep, our mood, our mobility and even lift our capacity to overcome life's constant challenges. This has happened to me. I am happier, more engaged and better supported by a community willing to provide my needs at a time when I most require them.

My thanks and appreciation go to the staff and Manager of the Walpole CRC. Without their efforts to engage and gain access at length for this programme, giving such broad support for those in need, this would not have occurred. Secondly, I would like to thank the sponsors of Meals on Wheels -Nathan Lee and Kristine Winsonfield - for without their generous contribution of cooked meals for the aged and disabled community in this area, this service would not exist.

I am appreciative of the volunteers delivering their 'gift of food' and that very special, very social contact. It leaves me with more energy and willingness to adhere to a comprehensive rehabilitation programme. I see my food as part of the kindness and generosity given by 'Walpole people'.


