

Nature Notes: Kangaroo Paws



The red and green Kangaroo paw (*Anigozanthos*) is Western Australia's floral emblem. Along with *Macropidia* (commonly known as the black kangaroo paw) they grow in the southwest of WA.

They are an important part of the cut flower market and are grown commercially in USA, Israel and Japan. Here in Walpole we have the green and black Kangaroo paws. The scientific team at Kings Park has used tissue culture to develop many hybrids of different colours and these are often grown by home gardeners. Cats' paws are also members of this family.

The flowers get their colour by hairs which grow all over the flower. The flowers are especially designed to attract pollinators, namely birds and small mammals such as honey possums. The flowers are tube shaped and attract creatures with nectar. A row of pollen-bearing antlers and a stigma are positioned at the top of the flower and as a bird or animal visits to drink the nectar, pollen is brushed on the forehead of the visitor; when visiting another flower fertilisation takes place. Cross-fertilisation is

prevented by the position of the deposited pollen. Seeds are then produced, but in gardening situations kangaroo paws are quite hard to propagate which is why commercial growers propagate them using tissue culture. This takes advantage of the fact that a plant cell is able to develop into a whole new plant.

Some Kangaroo paw clumps die back in winter and sprout again in summer. They have a lignotuber under the ground and energy is stored in this over the dormant period. The leaves are strappy and rush like and the green and black kangaroo paw seems to be able to grow in boggy areas and in clay soils. The green Kangaroo paw that we have around here is sometimes called the tall kangaroo paw, as they can grow up to a metre.

The Kangaroo paw is so-named because the end of the flower looks like a paw. The starchy roots have been used as a source of food for Noongar people. The plant has also been used as a source of red dye in the Northern Territory. The Noongar people call the Kangaroo paw *Kurulbrang* or *Nollamara* or *Yonga Marra* depending on the local language. We have so many amazing indigenous plants that it is easy to take them for granted.

Aged Care in Walpole



Hello, lovely people of Walpole!

My name is Mel and I am a trainer with My Flex Health.

I had the absolute pleasure of delivering a 3-day training package to some of your awesome support workers who will be ensuring some of the older locals can stay in their homes by providing them with support. How great is that!

I am very new to My Flex Health and was pretty nervous to stand in front of a group of strangers and deliver this training,



however I pulled my big girl knickers up, pushed the fear down and soldiered on. I am so glad I did, I'm not sure who had more fun, me or the support workers!

The 3 days consisted of personal care on Day 1 where everyone got to experience what it felt like to brush each other's teeth! I ask all of my participants to put themselves in their clients' shoes and practise on one another to really experience what it feels like. Having empathy is really important.

Day 2 was medication management which was a massive day! Most of the participants had not dealt with medications ever so were feeling pretty overwhelmed. At the end of the day, I pulled out my training bum which is a tool we use to educate about bowel medications. It can be a fairly embarrassing topic to teach and also an embarrassing topic to discuss for everyone. I use humour a lot to break the

ice and to help others feel comfortable; boy did we laugh that day? It was a really fun way to end the day!

Day 3 was manual handling, which was another big day! Everyone got to experience what it felt like to be assisted using mechanical aides like hoists, commodes and wheelchairs. I know when you say manual handling, everyone groans and thinks boring, but ask any of my participants. It was not a boring day!

I would like to thank Trinity, Cherie and Walpole CRC for hosting me, Jill Hayman for the amazing catering, and thanks to Care Community and Mable, who provided the funding for training. Rural areas are often forgotten and have limited access to training and funding.

I'm passionate about rural/regional areas being provided with adequate training and will continue to travel around doing so.

Again, a BIG thank you to everyone. I had a wonderful time doing what I love. I think Walpole now has the most highly qualified support workers in the country! How lucky you are!






