



Nature Notes: Termites - engineers of the insect world



Termites are a group of social insects. They are sometimes called white ants but they are of a completely different order, *Isoptera*. They are more closely related to cockroaches. They have pale brown to white bodies with a darker head. There is no waist between the thorax and abdomen. The antenna have bead-like segments. Workers do not have eyes and are blind, but reproductive types have compound eyes and wings. The workers have thin skins and stay in the nest to prevent drying out.

Reproductive types can venture outside the nest for short periods. The different orders of termites in a nest are as follows: Queen; King; worker; soldier (sometimes two ranks to defend the colony) and reproductive types - these can replace the king and queen if necessary and will probably leave the nest eventually. Some species of termite do not have a true worker class, with the individual taking on different roles during its life time. The stages of a termite's life are: egg, nymph and adult. The Queen may live up to 20 years and lay 1,000 eggs a day at the height of her fertility.

There are five types of nests and some species make more than one type. These are: ground mounds; pole nests in fenceposts or telegraph poles; subterranean nests in soil, under tree stumps and tree bases; tree nests inside the tree.

Termite colonies are maintained at high humidity. This protects the workers who have thin skins. Only when the humidity is at 100% can workers forage outside the nest. This is especially true of subterranean types which can only become a pest in buildings where dampness and water are a problem.

The nest is also kept at a stable temperature of 25-36 deg C. This is achieved in northern Australia by air conditioning! The termite mound is always built thicker across the east-west axis. This alignment means that the nest has most protection from the hot summer sun as it moves east to west across the mound, but can still be warmed in the cooler months due to the low angle of the sun.

As I have said in the title, termites are very good engineers and wood dwelling ones are experts at hollowing out structures without causing them to fall down. Termites who nest in trees cannot often eat the heartwood as they cannot digest it and the enzymes that the tree produces protect it. Living trees in our forest will often form burls of hard wood with a wrapping grain to deter insect attack. It is the sapwood that certain termites eat but not all termites eat wood; some eat grass and other matter. They are important recyclers in the forest, helping to break down dead trees and return carbon to the soil. In the savannah country in the north of Australia they are an important balancing organism, replacing grazing animals that are present in other savannah ecosystems throughout the world. Those that eat wood have special gut organisms that break down the cellulose into sugars. Some species have bacteria, others have protozoa, inside their guts. These are passed on to the nymphs or young termites by the adults.

Of the 258 described and 90 undescribed termite species in Australia only a few wood damaging species are of concern. One chemical free way of deterring termites is Termi Mesh; this works because a termite's head is as wide as the widest part of its body and the termite literally cannot get its head through the mesh.

Safe disposal and replacement of lithium phone batteries








- Unexpected Shutdowns: Phones powering off unexpectedly despite showing a reasonable battery percentage is a common sign of battery issues.
- Overheating: While phones can heat up during high usage, excessive heat during charging or light use may suggest battery problems.
- *Physical Bulging:* A bulging battery is a serious issue and can pose safety risks. If your phone's casing is pushed out or the screen is lifted, replace the battery immediately.

How to Properly Dispose of Lithium Phone Batteries

- batteries can pose fire risks if damaged or exposed to high heat. Therefore, they should never be disposed of in regular trash bins.
- Use Battery Recycling Services: Many electronics stores, waste management services, and community centres offer battery recycling programmes. These facilities ensure batteries are handled safely and their materials are recycled without harming the environment.

- Check Local Regulations: Some localities have specific rules about disposing of lithium batteries. Contact your local waste management or recycling centre to get guidelines specific to your area.
- *Prepare for Recycling*: If the battery is not already removed from the phone, take care to remove it without causing damage. If unsure, consult a professional. Tape over the battery terminals to prevent short-circuiting.
- *Transport Safely:* When transporting used batteries for recycling, place each battery in a separate plastic bag or cover terminals with tape to prevent short-circuiting or sparks.

Proper maintenance and timely replacement of phone batteries ensure not only the optimal performance of your smartphone but also contribute to environmental sustainability. By following the appropriate steps for disposal and being attentive to the signs of battery wear, users can enhance their device's longevity and help prevent environmental hazards. 

So, I put a post on the Walpole Facebook site to see if there would be any interest and little did I know women in Walpole love mosaic. By the end of the week I had 15 ladies all very keen to come. Then I realised I needed materials so I went to the local Tip Shop and managed to get a lot of tiles, glue, and grout. Also, the Manjimup Tip Shop had some lovely glass tiles we could use.

I then spoke to Nicole from the CRC who gladly donated some lovely coloured tiles from her shed. Another couple offered a large box of white tiles they didn't need. My husband, Kerry, still works in Perth every second week, so he went to Bunnings and bought tile cutters and all the other bits of equipment we needed.

We had to break up some of the tiles and there is something satisfying in grabbing a hammer and smashing something.

The room was very quiet given the number of women in the class, but they were all concentrating on their work and listening to Kez's instructions. Having Kez there to guide the workshop was undoubtedly invaluable, and it's clear that her expertise contributed to the success of the day. Once we had our design in place, we glued it to the base and then the next step, once it had dried, was to grout. The two hours passed quickly so some of us had to finish the work at home.

Kez and I then had a lunch break and got ready for the next group. It was another successful class and the ladies in Walpole are very artistic - and some of the work produced was a first attempt and showed great skill This class had the benefit of materials from the morning class - broken tiles! After another few hours of creative fun, it was time for us to pack up and head home. The ladies all left with smiles on their faces saying how much they had enjoyed their time with us. I was exhausted but happy that everyone enjoyed the day so much. I woke up to Facebook messages saying when could we do it again...
