

### Giveback Getdown + Wacky Hats Galore!



In the shadow of an unprecedented crisis, our farmers face a daunting convergence of challenges that could spell disaster for the cornerstone of our agricultural heritage. Recordbreaking drought conditions, the likes of which have not been seen in over half a century, have parched vast expanses of our fertile southwest, depleting dams and annihilating ground feed necessary for our livestock. Coupled with soaring feed costs, a plummeting confidence in the livestock export industry, and the inability of meat processing facilities to expand to meet current demand, the very survival of these farmers hangs in the balance. Geoff Pearson, WA Farmers livestock president, describes the situation as "critical", with no immediate relief in sight.

The Giveback Getdown arises not just in response to an urgent need, but as a call for solidarity with those who have stewarded our lands through generations. As livestock producers are forced to de-stock their properties amid falling prices - up to 75% lower than previous years - the future of live exports grows increasingly uncertain, the ripple effects threaten the backbone of our community's food security and economic well-being. The recent announcement by the WA government of \$8.6 million in support signals, recognition of the

severity of the crisis, yet the path to recovery requires a collective effort.

With every dollar raised, the Giveback Getdown aims to provide not just financial relief but a beacon of hope and support for mental health and community well-being, ensuring our local farmers have a robust range of resources to weather this storm. Funds will be directly allocated to farmers who are presently experiencing hardship.

To apply for a Community Support Grant or to nominate a deserving individual or family, please reach out to the Walpole Community Resource Centre (CRC) directly on admin@walpole.org.au. In order to qualify, you will need to be: a primary producer living in the local area (Crystal Springs through to Denmark) and able to produce a letter of proof from a livestock distributor, or stock agent, and experiencing hardship. This can mean there is a threat to animal welfare; insufficient pasture available to feed livestock; buying and transporting livestock feed etc..

Together, we can help secure a future where our farmers not only survive but thrive, sustaining the legacy of Western Australian agriculture for generations to come ANZAC Day at Peaceful Bay

With Sub-branch Chairman Joe Urquhart acting as MC, and Bob Eddington presenting the Anzac Day address, the short service was then followed by Sandon Phillips giving the most wonderful rendition

of 'I was only 19'. Many folk were heard to say it was the best version they had ever heard.

Wreaths were laid by Subbranch secretary Mrs Gail Guthrie on

behalf of the Peaceful Bay RSL Sub-Branch; Councillor Janine Phillips for the Shire of Denmark; Bob Eddington for the Peaceful Bay Progress Association; Sergeant Steve Page on behalf of WA Police and Legatee Gail Guthrie for Legacy WA. Dave Guthrie recited the Ode and Donna Haynes read the prayers.

It is estimated that between 300 and 400 attended the memorial - it being too dark to get an accurate count - which far outweighed expectations.

This was followed by a simple Gunfire Breakfast of bun, bacon and egg with tea, coffee and orange juice. Because Anzac Day had fallen outside of school holidays, the RSL Sub-branch had catered for 80 but 105 attended!

This was the motto for the Bike Skills Road Safety Ride on Sunday. We nearly cancelled it due to the weather forecast but we decided to give it a go anyways as kids love getting out in the rain and the mud. So why not!

Denmark Mountain Bike Club crew Nathan
Davenport and Karis Aplin were keen as mustard
even though it was bucketing down in Denmark as
they drove towards sunny Walpole. We had to make
a quick venue change to get some cover from the
intended rain but this was handled easily thanks to
our great band of parent helpers. The community bus
once again came in handy, ferrying out riders and
their bikes to the rendezvous point.

We had a great turn out with 20 children of all ages and 8 adult riders. The fluorescent Walpole CRC vests worn by all riders blazed through the forest. Accredited MTB Coach Nathan Davenport put the kids through some vigorous skills like braking, cornering, track stands and how to pick a line when riding the trails at speed. The kids were also in great hands with Accredited MTB Coach Karis Aplin keeping track of loose riders, helping with mechanics and giving technical tips along the trail.

We managed to have only one mishap when one rider took a wrong turn but was swiftly picked up by our expert sweeper on the trails, Mark Munro.

The group was taken through equipment safety checks and road safety rules before we set off on our first ride out to the highway along the very scenic Coalmine Trail.

We did have an endo on one treacherous section with a tree root and luckily the rider was thrown clear with no damage done to the tree. On return we were rewarded with a lunch of sausage sizzle and some spinach and cheese wrap toasties. There was also plenty of fruit and muesli bars on offer to keep the riders fuelled up. Thanks to the wonderful Brooke, Mark and Sandi for cooking those up for us. What a treat!

Our second ride was up into the H inside The Knoll.

This was where the real work was done with lots of technical corners, speed and line work. The senior riders really got to test



out their skills here and I could tell they really enjoyed it by the smiles on their faces and the concentration while being coached by Nathan.

The Denmark Mountain Bike Club coaching team were on point, concentrating on all the kids' skills and pushing them to become better. It was great to see how much some of the kids have improved over the 3 years we have been running this Bike Skills and Road Safety Ride. We have gone from tears, trainer wheels and tumbles to confident, skilful riders. The skills that they learned out there on Sunday will put them in good stead to become awesome safe riders long into the future.

None of this would be possible without the Road Safety Commission Grant the Walpole CRC obtained to celebrate National Road Safety Week,



5th-12th May 2024, implementing road safety messages to cyclists all over Western Australia. So, many thanks goes to the Walpole CRC, the Government of Western Australia and the Road Safety Commission. 


#### Rainfall Recap

#### Nature Notes: The Dibbler



The Dibbler was thought to be extinct until some were found near Albany. The scientific name is *Parantechinus apicalis*. They are an endangered nocturnal marsupial which hunt mice, birds and lizards and invertebrates. It is an attractive creature with speckled fur and white around the eyes. The Dibbler is also found on some off-shore islands including Boullanger, Whitlock and Escape Islands, near Jurien bay. There are also Dibblers in the Fitzgerald National Park and the Peniup Proposed Nature reserve which sits between the Stirling Range and Fitzgerald River National Park

These small marsupials are 10-16cms long and have a strong jaw and sharp teeth but they also consume berries and the nectar from flowering plants. The breeding season is from March to April and the female may have up to eight young. The Dibbler is not a social animal and mostly lives alone except for mating. Like all marsupials the female has a pouch and probably uses opportunistic breeding patterns. This animal has been reintroduced to Dirck Hartog Island and Guton Island in the Recherche Archipelago. There were attempts to introduce them to Stirling National Park and Waychinicup National Park but this does not seem to have been successful.

Like many small carnivorous animals in Australia, they are prey to foxes and feral cats. These species also compete with them for food. The Dibbler also prefers vegetation with a deep leaf litter and sandy environments. There is no shortage of sandy environments in Western Australia but burning bush reduces leaf litter which Dibblers use for nesting.

The International Union for the Conservation of nature has classed them as endangered. If you see one, report to the Department of Parks and Wildlife, a branch of DBCA.


