

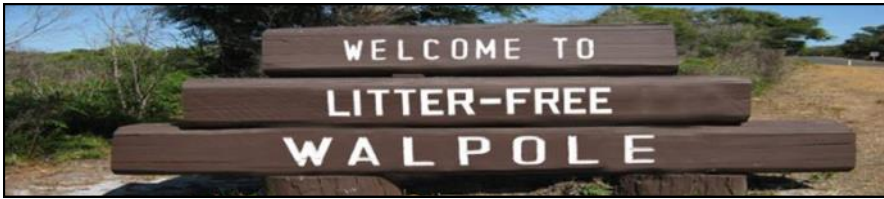

On Friday 12th July I embarked on a journey to Perth for an event that had been on my calendar for months - Perfectly Publishing Perth. Held in the historic Perth Town Hall on Saturday from 9am to 5pm, the event was organised by the romance writer Jo Mantle from Melbourne. Jo's planning and passion for the literary world truly shone through, making the event an unforgettable experience.

The hall was abuzz with excitement as 50 romance authors gathered for a day of book signings, allowing people to meet their

favourite writers and purchase their latest books. As the only children's author at the event, I found myself in a unique and advantageous position. Parents who brought their children were naturally drawn to my table, eager to find books for their little ones.

The variety of genres present was astonishing. As I set up my display, I couldn't help but notice the array of steamy romance novels that lined the tables. Across from me was a High School drama teacher who had published around 27 cosy murder mysteries. Her enthusiasm was infectious as she explained to a curious attendee that she "just loves murdering people" - in her stories, of course!

Directly behind me was a romance author from Brisbane. She shared a humorous story about how she has to keep her books relatively G-rated because her father and uncle are avid readers, despite her polite requests for them to refrain. It was a reminder of the often unexpected challenges writers face.

One of the most amusing moments was when I did a double-take at an author's banner that read 'Wilbur Smith.' Knowing the famous author had passed away a few years ago, I was initially puzzled. It turned out to be a clever marketing move by an author named Bill, who had won a Wilbur Smith Book Award and decided to use it to his advantage.

Rebecca Norman, another talented author, captivated many with her stories based on her grandparents' experiences during the Second World War, blending history with romance in a touching tribute. It was great to see how many of us draw inspiration from our real lives.

My own Bruiser Books series, for instance, is inspired by the adventures of our two dogs at home here in Walpole.

This event marked my first major author gathering in Perth, and it was a thoroughly enjoyable experience.

I loved the opportunity to connect with fellow authors, share stories, and learn from their journeys.

Perfectly Publishing Perth was more than just a book signing event - it was a celebration of creativity, passion, and the power of stories to bring people together.

As the day came to a close, I left with not only a sense of accomplishment but also a renewed inspiration to continue writing and sharing my tales with the world.

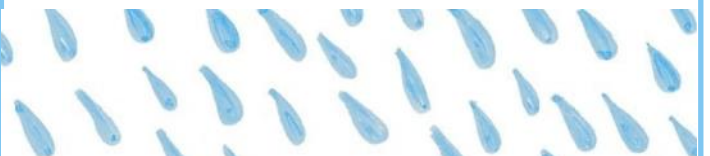

Update on Walpole borefield trial



The Walpole Borefield Trial has been progressing well, with positive results so far. However, in the coming weeks we

will be pausing the trial which focussed on the drier months of higher demand.

We will be discussing the trial's monitoring results, collected so far, with the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation. We will further engage with the community on the next steps as we work together to shape WA's water future.

Walpole's Water Treatment Plant requires minor additional work for the town's water supply to revert back to Butler's Dam. From Wednesday 10th July until the end of August 2024 we anticipate continuing to cart drinking water to Walpole. After this time, your drinking water will be supplied by Butler's Dam.

There will be increased truck movements, about 4-5 a day, near the water treatment plant on Plain Road. We ask all road users to take extra care during this time.

During this period, you may notice slight changes in your water's taste and appearance. We assure you that your water will continue to meet 100% of the health standards mandated by the Australian Drinking Water Quality Guidelines, set out by Department of Health.

If you have any concerns about your water supply, please call our 24/7 faults and emergencies line on 13 13 75. For other water carting enquiries please contact the Great Southern Region team via GSR.communications@watercorporation.com.au

Three generations of Kathy Broadbent's family volunteer for WA country ambulance service as more help needed



Third-generation St John volunteer Jarvis Wisewould, 19, wants to see other young people joining up to help their community.

A family of ambulance volunteers is calling on others to help keep a vital service alive on Western Australia's south coast.

Kathy Broadbent, a volunteer emergency medical technician with St John in the small town of Walpole, said regional Western Australia was desperate for more team members.

She has dedicated 29 years of her life to the volunteer service, with her daughter having done the same for 17 years, and her grandson recently signing up as well.

Ms Broadbent said the Walpole community relied on her and other volunteers to respond to emergencies and help take patients to vital appointments.

She said she joined to help the community, and knew better than most that it was a huge commitment. "I think this is why we struggle for volunteers," she said.

"But I think people who go through the process get a big sense of self-satisfaction from it."

St John Ambulance regional centres across the state rely on around 6,000 volunteers like Ms Broadbent to function, but having multiple family members in one centre is rare.

Ms Broadbent's daughter Danielle Wisewould volunteers with St John Ambulance (SJA) in Jerramungup, a small town north-east of Albany.

"With my mum being a volunteer, I felt like it was the right thing to do," Ms Wisewould said.

She said her mother was a major influence in deciding to join the SJA team.

Ms Wisewould said it was a common misconception that regional ambulance officers were paid.

"A few years ago, I was working in Bremer Bay on New Year's Eve and a young guy came up to me and said, 'Wow, you must be getting paid heaps of money tonight, it's New Year's Eve'," she said.

"I was like, 'I'm not getting paid, mate, I'm doing this out of the kindness of my heart.'"

"A lot of people think that we're paid but no, we're all just trying to help our fellow person."

Across the state, volunteers like Ms Broadbent and Ms Wisewould devote a total of almost 350,000 hours to this vital work each year, according to St John WA.

Ms Wisewould currently belongs to a team of five, but that is about to shrink with one member retiring.

St John volunteers take part in training at least twice a month. She said with limited volunteers, it placed a lot of pressure on others.

"It does get tricky when we've got a busy period ... sometimes we can have three [jobs] in a week, sometimes we won't have any in a month," she said. "If we are going down to Albany, we are looking at an eight-hour turnaround.

"We all work full-time, it comes down to being able to share the load."

Ms Wisewould said her volunteering has required sacrifices, and she believed that puts some people off joining.

"I've missed Christmas, I've missed birthdays - asking anyone to do that is hard," she said.

"But without the service, a small town falls apart. If somebody needs an ambulance and if we don't have the volunteers, we just can't do it."

While she was inspired by her mother, Ms Wisewould said she also became a volunteer so she would have the skill set to help her children if needed.

Now one of those children, 19-year-old Jarvis Wisewould, has put his hand up and joined the team. He is one of the youngest volunteers, and the third generation in his family providing services with SJA.

Mr Wisewould said he would like to see more of his own generation jumping on board.

“It’d be nice for a lot more younger people to start joining up, because some people aren’t going to be around forever,” he said.

“I just want to help out the community as much as I can.”
