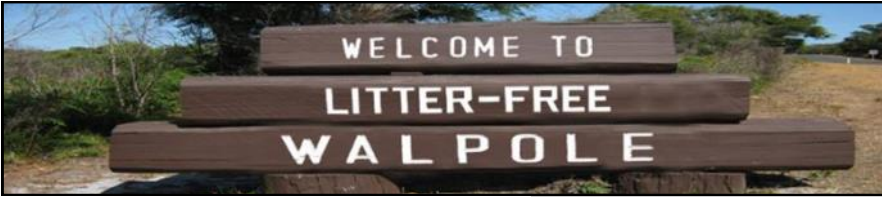

Lilian Moorcroft, a trained speech therapist working with Superyou, has recently moved to Walpole with her partner Cale and their dog Daisy. Speech therapists can work across lots of different areas, such as voice disorders, speech and language difficulties, literacy, dysphagia (eating, drinking and swallowing difficulties) and complex communication needs. Often the jobs they have and environments they work in shape the sorts of skills and experience they can offer.

While Lilian is a city kid at heart, her and her partner have regularly visited Walpole and surrounds, and fell in love with the unspoiled natural beauty of the Walpole wilderness area, the abundant outdoor activities and the friendly community. But that's not the only reason they decided to make the move. In 2022, Lilian completed a Telethon-funded project that saw her visiting the Great Southern region to support people using eye-gaze controlled computers to communicate. During this time she recognised the significant need for speech therapy services in the region; a big factor encouraging her to consider a tree change.

Lilian's work with Superyou is focused across two main areas of clinical practice. Firstly, supporting people with complex communication needs to find the best tools, technology and strategies to help them communicate and connect more easily with others. Secondly, to support people with eating, drinking and swallowing difficulties to enjoy mealtimes as safely as possible. Currently she is focused on working with people who have needs in these two areas. This ensures she can remain up to date on the latest research evidence and support people to achieve meaningful outcomes.

Lilian joined Superyou Therapy in 2023 - Superyou is an NDIS therapy provider with locations across Perth and Peel region, and now the Great Southern.

AN UPDATE ON THE TWO COMMUNITY RESILIENCE WORKSHOPS



For those who missed the previous posting in the Walpole Weekly; here is a little recap.

The aim of a Community Resilience Group is to provide a venue where members of the community can gather, get information, and provide mutual support during an emergency. This could be during a fire, storm, flooding, heat wave or major incident. It doesn't replace an evacuation centre.

As stated previously, the government has said on numerous occasions that they may not be there to help. The Red Cross says that when there is a real emergency, 95% of help comes from within 500 metres of your door. As one workshop participant put it, 'It is just about mates helping mates'.

The Balingup Community set up their Resilience Centre a couple of years ago following bushfires and an extended blackout and loss of communications. They were concerned about the gap between the emergency (in their case, fire) and advice on how to get accurate information when communications were down. This resulted in them getting funding to set up a generator and free internet connection that the public could use. They also have an air conditioned centre that can provide food, comfort, refreshments, moral and physical support, and most importantly, communications.

Recognition that other communities might like to piggyback and share on their successful project, the Balingup community pitched the idea to Rural Aid who provided funding in order to replicate this idea for six other towns in WA.

Walpole and Nornalup were chosen for the first two workshops. Balingup's past Progress Association president Wendy Trow offered to facilitate the two workshops at Walpole and Nornalup. They were held on 22nd and 23rd of June.

The attendance was fantastic, given that it was an awfully cold and wet weekend, so we thank everyone for their attendance and valuable contributions. We all learned a lot, not just from Wendy, but from each other.

We also found that many of us had no idea where to get accurate and up to date information or who to report to in case of an emergency.

Only one workshop participant at the Nornalup workshop knew who the local Denmark Shire LEMC (Local Emergency Management Committee) representative was. Do you?

4 - 3rd July, 2024

The overwhelming concern for most is the frustration and fear that we may be without communications for extended periods of time. This is something we have all experienced, including a time when some local people were without any phone service for 5-6 weeks!

Two committees were formed for Walpole and Nornalup to continue to gather information and create an effective plan, plus lobby for better community infrastructure.

Why two communities with separate committees? In most circumstances they will work in tandem, but both have different resources and needs and in some emergencies they may be isolated from each other.

So, what now? We are on a fact-finding mission. Committee members will begin to list all the assets and find the people that can help in an emergency, contact numbers; the what, where and who, including those who can help in a recovery phase. A community in action plan will be developed and that information will be shared where it is needed.

This is a committee unlike any other. Once the information has been collated and an action plan put in place, it is almost a sit, set and forget until needed. Meetings may only need to be once a year to update information and inform others of any changes.

While lack of power and communications are the main focus in an emergency, we also cannot forget how to look after neighbours, pets, farm animals, wildlife, people who cannot access money, food and fuel, tourists, people who are frail, those with special needs and the less tech savvy. The two committees will be working on how best to support those people in an emergency.

As we progress, we will provide regular updates and we welcome your ideas and inputs. In the meantime, a huge thank you to the 25 participants who came to the two workshops to kick start the Walpole and Nornalup Community Resilience Centre/s.

In the meantime, we need to acknowledge our dedicated local volunteer services such as St John's Ambulance, Fire Brigades, The SES and Sea Rescue, who do such vital work on our behalf.

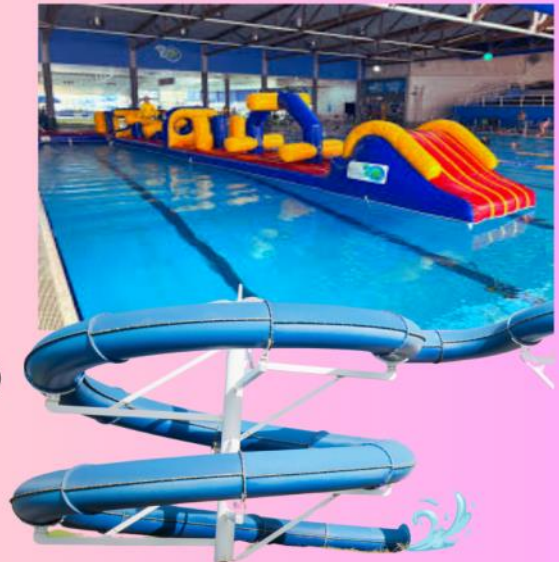

Natural Resource Management Funding

The Shire has been successful in securing three years (\$90,000) of State Natural Resource Management funding to undertake revegetation works at Windy Harbour and to empower the community to manage threatened species habitats.

The project will enable eleven hectares of ecological restoration in sensitive coastal areas within the Windy Harbour settlement. Activities such as weed control and coastal dune planting will protect the threatened flora in the area and help restore the area back to pristine condition. Protective structures will be installed to direct pedestrians away from sensitive areas. The funding will raise awareness of how to care for threatened species that live in the Shire of Manjimup. Managing threatened species habitats involve activities such as fauna monitoring and vegetation surveys.
